Catholics have honored the last week of Jesus' life since the Apostles. **Holy Week**, stretching from Palm Sunday to Holy Saturday, is a time to reflect on all that Jesus suffered for us. It is a time to worship him as our king, and remember the light he brings to a dark world.


During the spring term our whole school theme focuses on the Catholic Social Teaching – Stewardship (Care for God's Creation)




RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

God wants us to help people who are poor, who don't have enough food, a safe place to live, or a community.




THE DIGNITY OF WORK AND THE RIGHTS OF WORKERS

Work is important in God's plan for adults and their families, so jobs and pay should be fair.




God made everyone, so we are all brothers and sisters in God's family wherever we live.

God made each person, so every life is important and should be protected.








