School Uniform Policy 2018/2019

At St Clare's we are proud to show that we belong and we show this by wearing smart uniform every day. Children and their parents are responsible for ensuring that they are wearing the correct uniform every day.

Please work with the school as we try to maintain the school ethos and standards by sending your child to school in the correct school uniform.

Brown school jumper with the school logo

Blue shirt with collar and

school tie or

blue polo shirt.

Grey school trousers

Plain brown, grey, white or black socks may be worn.



Ties must be worn with collared shirts. All shirts must have their buttons done up.

Plain **black**, sensible shoes (not trainers or boots or shoes with logos)

Girls

Blue blouse with school tie or blue polo shirt.

Brown cardigan or school jumper with the school logo.

Brown skirt/ pinafore. If girls choose to wear trousers they must be grey. (not fashion trousers)

Plain brown, grey, white or black tights/socks may be worn.

Children need to come to school in their school shoes – not their trainers. Please do not send your child with 'hooded' sweaters as these are dangerous. Please try to avoid zips in sweaters and jumpers as these can also be a hazard.

Other uniform rules

Children are not allowed to wear a t-shirt or long sleeved top underneath their school shirt if it can be seen.







Grey trousers or shorts, brown or blue and white check dress, blue short-sleeved shirt or blue polo shirt.

No leggings to be worn at anytime





<u>PE Kit</u>

Black shorts (**not** leggings or knee length), plain white T-shirt Pumps - not trainers.

Trainers may be worn when doing outdoor activities or for special sporting events.



Marking Uniform

Please label clearly with your child's name all items of school uniform and make sure that coats and jackets have a loop for hanging up.

Jewellery

For reasons of health and safety, children cannot wear necklaces, bracelets and finger rings. **Sensible stud earrings in gold or silver are permitted (one in each ear)** but must be removed for P.E. and swimming. Studs with gems/stones are **not** permitted. Watches maybe worn by older children (Year 3 and above) but these must be of a sensible size, no alarms allowed and they must be removed for P.E./swimming.

Nail varnish or make up should not be worn at any time.











Hairstyles and headwear

Our school policy on hairstyles is outlined below. Here are a few samples to show you how to follow our policy. If there are some haircuts we deem to be unsuitable, that are not pictured here, parents will be contacted.

 Severe or individualistic styles (eg where a part of the hair is cut very short and another part left longer) are not allowed

Boys' hair should not exceed collar length nor be cut too short (not less than a number 2).



• Sharp lines between shaved/very short hair and longer hair are not allowed – these must be blended



Hairstyles and headwear continued

• Dyed hair is not allowed



- Patterns/lines and cuts shaved into hair or eyebrows are not allowed
- Hair of shoulder length or longer must be tied back
- Beads attached to hair are not allowed
- Coloured weaves are not allowed
- Hats or scarves are not allowed to be worn in school



• Large headbands or other hair accessories are not allowed to be worn. Simple headbands to hold hair back must be black, blue, brown or white.





Sanctions

If a child arrives in school without the correct uniform these are the sanctions:

- No playtime (withdrawn from morning break)
- No trips
- Not able to represent St Clare's as part of a team/competition
- Not able to be a leader in our school such as House Captain/Play Leader/Star of the Week
- Not able to be nominated for rewards such as 'Always Good Child'

Each time a child fails to follow the school uniform policy then you will be contacted to provide the correct uniform.
